theirs for the night.



| Taylor | (Camper) Lead | A little girl who seems to be afraid of nothing. Very outgoing, athletic, curious and bright. She is also very shy, though, because of a speech impediment she had as a very young child. | 7 |
| Cookie | Mannequin Cook | Bumbling "cook" mannequin from housewares and kitchen supplies. Cookie is easily terrified of anything she doesn't know about. And there's very little she knows about. Clumsy, fearful, yet good-hearted. | 6 |
| Tatiana | Mannequin Princess | Queen of the mannequins. Tatiana believes she truly is a queen and simply tolerates the "common" mannequins she is forced to work with. She is the source of most of the wisdom of the mannequins and "knows" the history of their world the store. | 6 |

Before the bold lines are the lines that are spoken right before the audition part (Please memorize the bold line for the audition) Some of the parts with fewer lines don't have the leading line listed beforehand.- Some characters may have vocal solos.

CANDY: For BigStuff News Network, this is Candy Little reporting! A huge police standoff is underway at the Mondo-Mart store in Forest Creek. With me is Deputy Tess Andrews. Deputy Andrews, can you tell me what's going on?

MRS. JONES: (Taken from Scene 1)

KIM: Taylor, the store's closing. Besides, I really don't think ...

MRS. JONES: My goodness, you are quite the hide-and-seek player!

MR. EBENEZER: (Taken from Scene 6)

BARNEY: (blurts) Well, that's a good trick. How do you do that?

EBENEZER: It's not easy, but we're committed to communicating the true meaning of the holidays, so people know that they (looking directly into and pointing at the "camera") can save 40% throughout the store, here at Mondo-Mart—thru December 24th!
